What does this cost?

There are no costs to you to participate.

All study materials will be provided by the researchers and delivered to you.

This study will be conducted remotely, so you do not need to travel anywhere.

Could this research study be bad for me?

Niclosamide has few side effects and is known to be well-tolerated even when given over a long period.

Reported side effects of niclosamide are mild and infrequent. These may include GI disturbances, lightheadedness, tiredness, body aches, and itching.

Alcohol may enhance the absorption of niclosamide, increasing the risk of side effects, and should be avoided when taking this drug.



Getting tested for COVID-19?



Participate in a COVID-19
Clinical Study from the Comfort of Your Home.

Why did I get this brochure?

You are being tested for COVID-19. If your results are positive, you may be eligible to participate in a clinical research study conducted by researchers at Tufts Medical Center and Tufts Clinical and Translational Science Institute (CTSI). You can participate in this study remotely, from home, with no need to travel. If you are interested, it is important to contact the study team within three days of your test.

What is the clinical research study?

COVID-19 is a public health emergency for which there are no known effective outpatient treatments.

The name of this study is Niclosamide for Patients with Mild to Moderate Disease from Coronavirus (COVID-19).

The purpose of the study it to find out if niclosamide (a medication taken by mouth) can shorten the time that COVID-19 is contagious and if it works to shorten the time of symptoms resulting from COVID-19 infection.

What do I need to do?

If you are interested in participating in this research study, someone will explain the study to you and you can decide if you want to take part. You can also decide not to take part at all, or decide to take part and later change your mind.

To be eligible, you need to:



Receive a positive test result for COVID-19



Contact the study team



Provide consent to participate if you are interested



Participate from home through a telehealth platform

What else do I need to know?

- It is important to contact the study team within three days of your test.
- Participation will be virtual. You will not have to see the researchers in-person.
- The researchers will explain your rights as a research participant.
- There will be 10 check-ins with the research team. These will happen online or by phone.

Travel will not be required for any reason.

The researchers will use couriers to send materials to you, and to bring materials back to the researchers.

The researchers will notify your primary care doctor about your participation in this clinical research study.
